

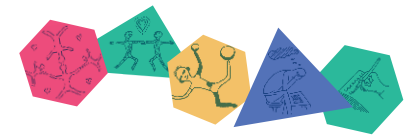
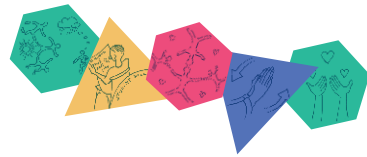
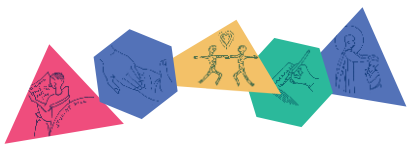

How to use these prayers

This prayer resource contains 15 prayers that have been written or adapted to be used during Social Justice Week 2018. With the theme of *Enabling Communities: Everyone has a part to play*, these prayers are designed to help guide our focus on issues around disability and inclusion.

Prayers are divided into three sections to cater for the different levels: junior primary (Y1-4), upper primary (Y5-8), and secondary (Y9-13). Five prayers are available for each level, so classes may choose to use one prayer each day.

As disability and inclusion are central to the unit, there are multiple ways that the prayers can be communicated:

- Displayed on a screen (or printed out)
- Listened to via the link on the page
- Through New Zealand Sign Language via the link on the page

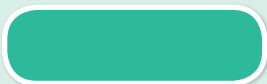

help me to share your love.

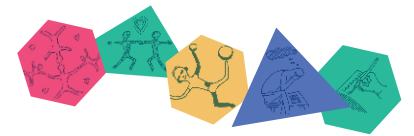
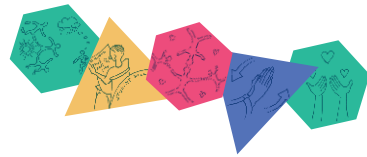
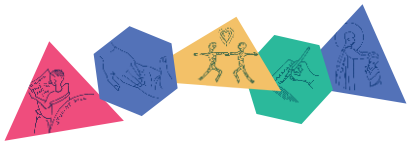

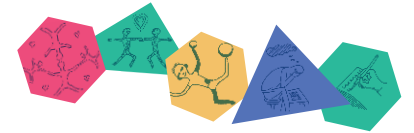
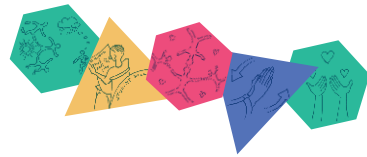
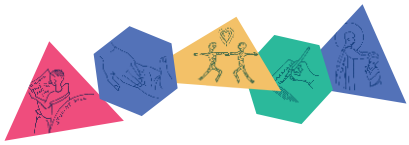
Forgiving God,

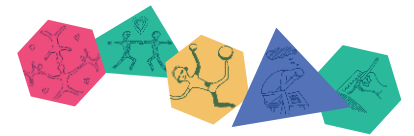
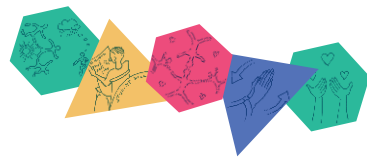
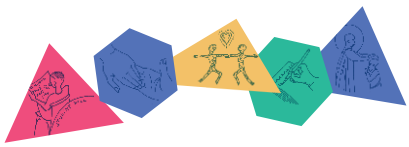
