Activity 2: Wants or needs?



What surprised you about this story?

What is something about your life that might surprise the children in the story?

This story does not show you EVERYTHING.

Here are three challenges that the children on Kapo Island face.

1. They have to paddle in canoes every day for more than 15 minutes to go to school. Sometimes the sea can be rough and they can get tipped out.
2. The mosquitoes can bite and give them malaria. This makes them very sick with a fever for a long time. The nearest hospital is eight hours drive away.
3. The only fresh water for drinking, washing and cooking comes from the mainland in 20-litre containers. This needs to come by boat EVERY DAY.

What do you think the children need?

Find out more about:

- **how to turn a canoe upright after it has capsized**
- **malaria (*also see Worksheet 10*)**
- **how much water the average person uses in New Zealand per day.**
